MCBC Academy Overview

MCBC (Mt. Calvary Baptist Church) Academy is an educational program which, in its first year, will provide free individualized tutoring to schoolchildren, ages 5-18. MCBC Academy falls under the aegis of Mt. Calvary Baptist Church of Rome, NY. Tutoring will initially be offered once a week at Mt. Calvary Baptist Church. Each student will receive 60 minutes of tutoring.

Student Eligibility and Requirements:

Students who score below grade level in reading or math, or have other learning needs, are eligible for the program. Each student will receive a pre and post test to determine eligibility and greatest area of need. Referrals for student enrollment may come from schools, parents, churches, synagogues, community agencies, word-of-mouth, etc. All parents must complete a student questionnaire, a photo release form and agree to supply the program with a copy of their child's report cards for our files.

Volunteering:

Volunteers will be program trained by the coordinator and will conduct a weekly one-on-one session with a child (or children) who are in need of tutorial assistance. All tutors will receive ongoing support by the coordinator and fellow volunteers. There are a variety of ways to volunteer:

- Assigned tutors are matched with one child for a 60 minute weekly session.
- **Partner tutors** alternately share the responsibility of tutoring one child with a fellow tutor.
- On-call (substitute) tutors fill in for tutors who must cancel a session.

No teaching experience is necessary, only a high school degree. Volunteers give their time and are given training and support.

Family Involvement and Support:

Family involvement is vitally important to the success of every child. Staff will work closely with parents toward their children's educational goals. If issues arise with a child or their parent, which transcend tutoring practices, we will refer the person(s) to appropriate services.

MCBC Academy will provide tutorial services in the following phases:

Phase I

One-on-One Tutorial - once weekly 3:30PM-4:30 PM/4:45 PM-5:45 P.M./6:OOPM-7:OOPM

Phase II

One-on-One Tutorial - twice weekly Math Lab - once weekly

Phase HI
